- On Earth Day, Eco Echo will host a panel of experts Christian Messier, Ronnie Dreaver and Chantale Doucet who will discuss the evolution of the MRC des Collines-de-l'Outaouais' forest canopy. Their presentation will be followed by a screening of the film "Inhabit: A Permaculture Perspective".
- Also starting in April, artist cj fleury will be giving one of Eco Echo's two-hour Mapping the Community Forest workshops, in which participants can find out just how much the forests have changed over the past 300 years. Participants will be invited to add their creativity to a collective art and science exhibit, which will be shared throughout the MRC. Spots can be reserved at www.ecoecho.ca
- In May, Eco Echo will host Tree Canada's national board of directors to highlight the action taken by the Outaouais Environmental Campus in support of Canada's 2 Billion Trees Commitment. Part

- of that commitment included planting 20,000 trees on the Minnes Farm –also known as Eco Echo – in 2020.
- Christian Messier, forest ecology professor at Université du Québec en Outaouais (UQO) and UQAM (in Montreal), will continue collaborating with the MRC to share research on the Community Forest Canopy, with the goal of encouraging all six municipalities to work together to protect and care for this vital natural resource.
- POCO (La Pêche Organic Community Orchard) volunteers, who have been having great success on the campus' one-acre organic orchard, are looking forward to another fruitful season.
- A series of workshops on permaculture will be hosted online and at Eco Echo, such as the Forest Education workshops in the fall of 2024.

## Earth Day: healing ourselves, healing the planet

The Theme of Earth Day 2024 is Planet vs Plastic. Recently, I had participated in a hard-hitting, online learning experience\* with Linda Vanderlee (Living Aligned Coaching) and Andrea Prasmowski (Forest Therapy, Ottawa), which disclosed that every week we absorb a credit card's worth of microplastics. One million plastic bags are being produced every minute. Babies are particularly vulnerable to absorbing microplastics, which constitute a serious health risk to everyone.

With regard to community collaboration: Last week, as Biblio Wakefield Library liaison, I had the privilege of meeting with cj fleury, Shelley Crabtree

and Gillian Kirkland to problem-solve with Christopher Minnes (Eco Echo) about mounting the art installation that will be highlighted during Earth Day celebrations at Centre Wakefield La Pêche, with help from Laura Birks who works for the centre. The installation was created in workshops held all over the MRC, resulting in breathtaking panels that invite us to enter into a deeper awareness of and knowledge about our forests. The multi-layered funding, collaborative problem solving, creative inspiration and pragmatic expertise involved, based on ecological conviction, provides stunning evidence of what is possible.

Returning to alignment with the earth: I attended a sign-making workshop for Partagé Community Garden Community. We talked about policy regarding food waste and inclusiveness as we worked in the garden. There's something about working with your hands and discussing chalenging topics that contributes to balance and calm. We also discussed how many splendid proposals arose from the public consultation hosted by the La Pêche Commission for Developing a Climate Action Plan.

We hope that the commission will recommend a strategy for mobilizing motivated community members aligned with the earth and offering a variety of skills that will help members work together in a systematic way to continue contributing to climate, ecological and social justice and resilience.
